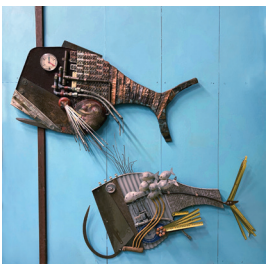


From The Fish Shop and Beyond
